

Irving Rumann Talks on Geology

Irving J. Rumann, curator of Geology of the Buffalo Museum of Science, addressed the members of the Strohaver Science Club at a meeting on Thursday, April 4th, at which time Mr. Rumann spoke on the "Geology of New York."

During the course of the speech the members of the club were informed that, "due to the large glacier covering the area north of the Great Lakes region, the water of the Niagara River flows from North to South." Mr. Rumann also explained that the large number of fossil rocks now found in this area gives evidence of marine life. This is due to the fact that the area was in a very warm climate, and was covered by a large body of water. He pointed out the coral reefs found in Williamsville as an example.
